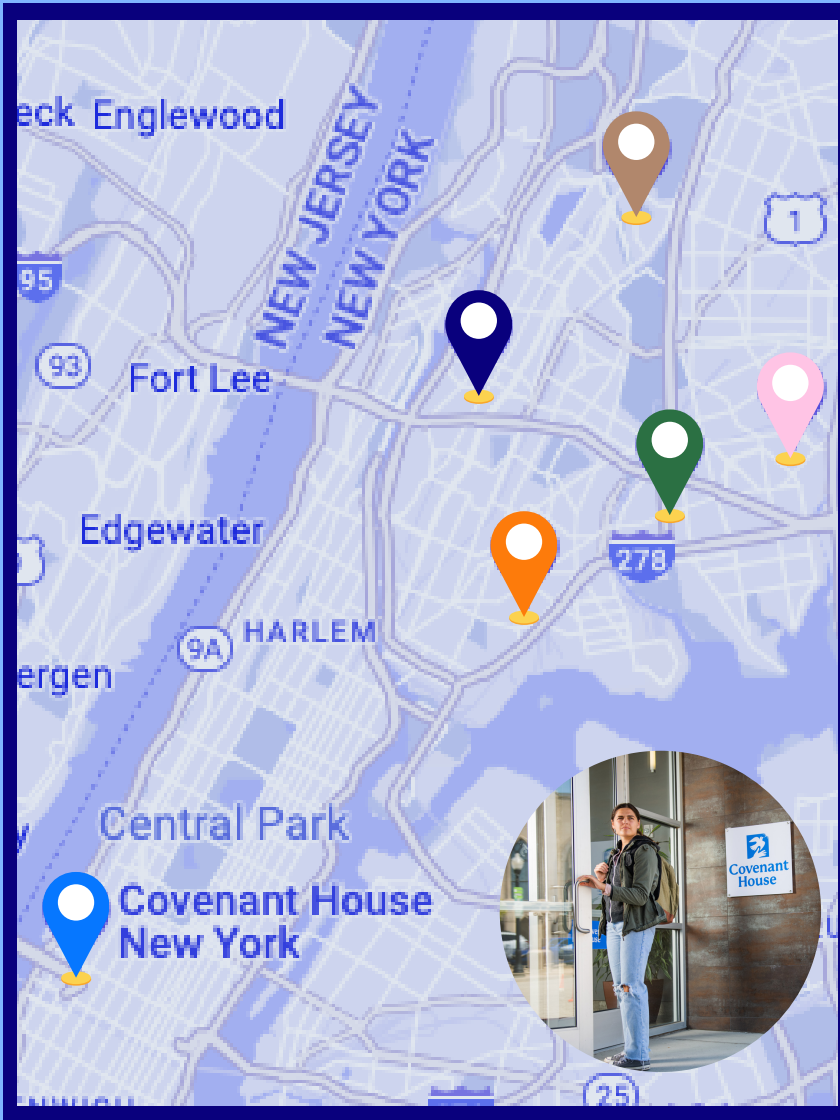

Midtown Shelter

CHNY addresses the youth homelessness epidemic, which is vast. According to the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Annual Homeless Assessment Report to Congress, on a single night in 2022, New York City had the highest number of unaccompanied youth experiencing homelessness of any city in the United States, with 2,094 individuals under the age of 25 - accounting for 7% of the total U.S. unhoused youth population.

The majority of youth experiencing homelessness are Black, followed by Latino. In line with national research, the youth who come to CHNY present with high rates of chronic health conditions, mental health challenges, and educational and employment deficits.

Crisis Shelter & Short-term Housing Programs

Youth can reside in these programs for up to 120 days.

- **Midtown Shelter:** Flagship site in Manhattan, serving youth ages 16-21.
- **Mothers & Babies Shelter (Stepping Stones):** In the Bronx, serving young mothers ages 16-21 and their babies/toddlers.
- **Female Shelter (Bridge House):** In the Bronx, serving female-identified young adults ages 21-24.



Rights of Passage & Transitional Independent Living Programs

Youth can reside in these programs for up to 24 months.

- **Mothers & Babies (ASJ):** In the Bronx, serving young mothers ages 16-21 and their babies/toddlers.
- **Female-Identifying Youth (ASJ):** In the Bronx, serving female-identified young adults ages 16-21.
- **Male-Identifying Youth (Fteley):** In the Bronx, serving male-identified young adults ages 16-21.
- **Any Youth in Age Range (Infinity House/Glebe):** In the Bronx, serving young adults ages 16-24.

OUR HOUSING CONTINUUM

In addition to crisis shelter and transitional housing programs, Covenant House New York offers a wide array of permanent housing options for youth in New York City.

Joint Transitional Housing/Rapid Re-Housing

This program combines our traditional Rights of Passage program with a Rapid Re-Housing model to ensure seamless transition into a permanent, independent setting. Rapid Re-Housing is a recent innovative housing model that employs a Housing First approach, providing immediate placements through a scattered-site model (meaning that units are located in various apartment buildings and do not have a central location) with short-term rental assistance and case management services to ensure young adults obtain and remain in permanent housing. Housing placements are provided to young adults ages 18-24 at program start, and youth can receive CHNY services for up to 24 months. There is no maximum length of stay.

Family Covenant

Family Covenant is our Permanent Supportive Housing program for young adult families. Family Covenant operates exclusively through a scattered-site supportive housing model. The program provides housing and parental support through evidence-based treatment models to improve parenting skills and ability to live independently. This program provides 30 apartment units to young adults ages 18-24 at program start, who are considered a family unit, and who have a mental health diagnosis. This is not the same as our Mothers & Babies program model, as family units can be male or female, single or couples, with or without a child. There is no maximum length of stay.

Wraparound Services

Youth who reside in all of our programs have access to a wide array of supportive wraparound services, both at our midtown Manhattan shelter and Bronx hub located at Glebe Avenue, as well as on location where they live. These services include, but are not limited to:

- Healthcare (at our Federally Qualified Health Center, located onsite at pr midtown shelter)
- Mental health treatment (both individual and group settings)
- Educational and vocational support through our CovWorks program
- Legal services
- Youth development programming
- Benefits enrollment through our Single Stop program
- Housing assistance
